

Prevent Balloon Litter

- A regional community-based social marketing campaign
- Balloons and their attachments are among the deadliest forms of marine debris
- Balloon debris very commonly found on beaches in the Mid-Atlantic



Prevent Balloon Litter: Project Background & Need

- Virginia piloted the *Joyful Sendoff* campaign within the state
- Work group sought to expand *Joyful Sendoff* to regional scale
- Funded by NOAA Marine Debris Program in FY18



Prevent Balloon Litter: Approach and Results

- Focus groups and surveys
- Campaign message development
- Beach monitoring

Prevent Balloon Litter: Results of Focus Groups & Surveys

- NJ Results (199 participants)
- 51% have taken part- 57% would take part in the future
- 76% thought about where it would end up



Why are they releasing?

Emotional Language from survey:

"A celebratory joy" "A feeling of serenity" "A sense of togetherness" "Awesome! "Beautiful tribute to a life lost "Excitement" "Freedom" "Freedom" "Fun" "Grief, had just lost a very important person in my life." "Guilt because I knew it was wrong but I didn't want to offend the individuals who had, their child."

"Happy thoughts of the person who had died filled my mind." "We felt connected to the woman who has left us." "It's a sense of peace" "Joy, happiness, optimistic" "Love, pain, acceptance, hope" "Loved it! " "Release of sadness" "Relief/Closure" "Remembrance" "Sadness"



Events/Pledges

- 5 States
- 32 events were attended
- 1,057 pledges



Regional Beach Monitoring

- One (1) mile stretch of beach
- Twice a year cleanups/monitoring
- Trash Collected and Recorded
- Data input across five state



New Jersey Balloon Monitoring

- October 2018- October 2023
- Island Beach State Park
- 5-10 Volunteers

Balloon Monitoring NJ Results

- 2018: 710 Non-Balloon Related, 86 Balloon Related
- 2019: 1,421 Non-Balloon Related, 81 Balloon Related
- 2020: Canceled due to Covid
- 2021 (One cleanup): 349 Non-Balloon Related, 12 Balloon Related
- 2022: 1,443 Non-Balloon Related, 47 Balloon Related
- 2023: 1,550 Non-Balloon Related, 32 Balloon Related
- 62.79% Decrease in balloons found
